

Rose Tremain's bestselling novels have been published in 27 countries and have won many prizes, including the Orange Prize (The Road Home and - shortlisted - The Colour), the Whitbread Novel of the Year Award (Music and Silence) and the James Tait Black Memorial Prize and Prix Femina Etranger (Sacred Country). She is also the author of award-winning short stories and TV plays. Rose Tremain lives in Norfolk and London with the biographer. Richard Holmes.

Louis de Bernières IMAGINING ALEXANDRIA

Poetry was Louis de Bernières' first literary love and Imagining Alexandria is his debut poetry collection. Here he returns us to the vivid Mediterranean landscape of his fiction. De Bernières was introduced to Greek poetry while in Corfu in 1983, and since then he has always travelled with a book of Cavafy's poetry

in his pocket. His own poems owe much to the influence of the great Alexandrian poet.

Louis de Bernières won the Commonwealth Writers' Prize for his famous novel **Captain Corelli's Mandolin**. Imagining Alexandra is published by Random House.





Hilton Pashley GABRIEL'S CLOCK



Hilton lives in Norwich where he works as a civil servant and magistrate. Gabriel's Clock is his debut novel. He began writing Gabriel's Clock several years ago, after the death of a close friend reminded him that life is too short not to try something new.

He writes for children aged ten to thirteen. He hopes that the book will give them a place to go where they can be themselves; the hidden village of

Hobbes End, loosely based on the beautiful Norfolk village of Heydon.

Hilton chose to write for children as it gives him the freedom to be as imaginative as a child. He loves to come up with new worlds for readers to get lost in, and the enjoyment of hearing what readers have to say about those worlds when they return from the adventure.



Andrew Cowan WORTHLESS MEN

Weaving together multiple viewpoints, Andrew Cowan creates a panoramic, extraordinarily vivid portrait of a place as individual as it is archetypal. Here is a community where the war permeates high and low; where the factory now produces barbed wire, the women are doing the men's jobs, and the young men



are no longer so eager to answer the King's call. And here is the tragic story of a casual betrayal, and a boy who proved that those at the bottom of the heap - the worthless ones - could be the most valiant of them all.

Andrew Cowan was educated at the University of East Anglia. Pig, his first novel (published in 1996), was longlisted for the Booker, shortlisted for five other literary awards and won the Sunday Times Young Writer of the Year Award, the Authors' Club First Novel Award and a Scottish Council Book Award. He is also the author of the writing guidebook The Art Of Writing Fiction and four other novels. Andrew Cowen is the Director of the Creative Writing programme at UEA.




